## **ACTIONS:**

✓ Multi-drug resistant infection

1. Meet the owners outside and escort them in via a separate entrance, or use a carrier or gurney to transport the pet through the reception area if necessary.

✓ Sudden onset of coughing, sneezing, vomiting, or diarrhea (± a fever)

- 2. Use alternative waiting/examination locations, or use barrier precautions (e.g., gloves, gown, booties) based on the initial risk assessment.
- 3. Clean and disinfect any waiting or examination locations occupied before using those areas again for other animals.
